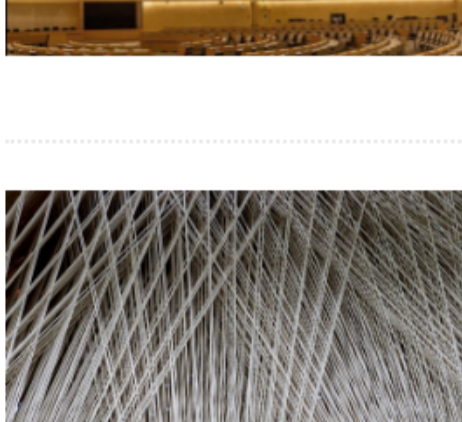


**The Global Compact for Safe, Orderly and Regular Migration: Progress, Challenges and the Way forward to a Principled Implementation.**

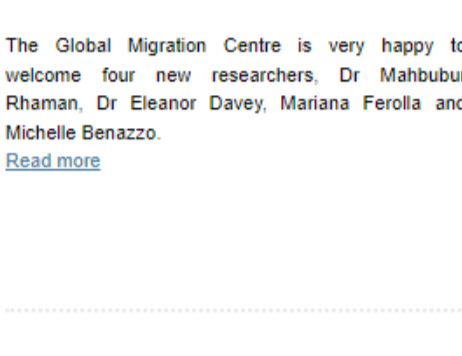

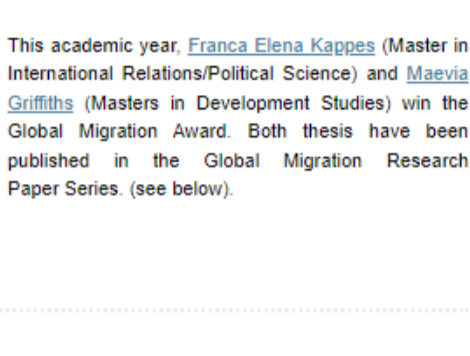

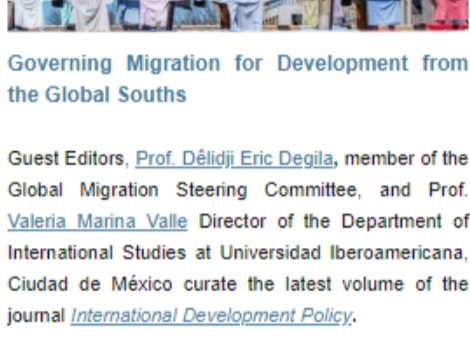
**Global Migration Laureates**

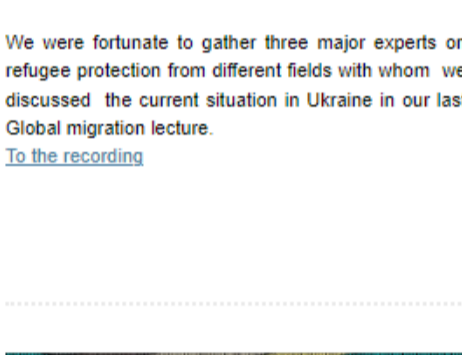

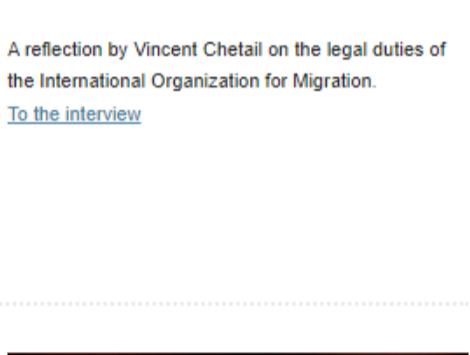
**Governing Migration for Development from the Global Souths**
