


Vera Michalski-Hoffmann | Class of 1978

Vera Michalski-Hoffmann presides over a broad publishing network located in France, Poland and Switzerland, under the umbrella name of *Libella SA*, based in Lausanne. She created the Jan Michalski Foundation, named after her late husband, as a place to nourish burgeoning writers and encourage the love of reading. The Foundation houses a library, auditorium and exposition hall, and welcomes writers who are completing a residency for a literary project. As a literary benefactor, Vera Michalski-Hoffmann has an undeniable voice in literary circles.

Vera Michalski-Hoffmann met her husband Jan Michalski in Geneva at the Graduate Institute. In 1986 they launched a publishing house in Switzerland, *Éditions Noir sur Blanc*. In Paris they acquired the historic Polish bookstore *Librairie polonaise*, founded in 1833. The Libella group now includes a dozen publishing houses in Switzerland, France and Poland.

In 2004, Vera established the Jan Michalski Foundation in Montricher in her husband's memory. The Foundation fosters literary creation, encourages the practice of reading, makes a large multilingual library available to the public, awards an annual prize in world literature, grants financial support to literary projects worldwide, and hosts a writer-in-residence programme.

Vera Michalski-Hoffmann tries to develop literature and art through diverse foundations where she is involved such as the *Fondation pour l'Écrit* in Geneva, the *Fondation pour l'Art dramatique du Théâtre Vidy* in Lausanne, but also in the *Fondation des Alliances Françaises* and the *Syndicat National de l'Édition* en France in Paris. Since 2016, she has been a UNESCO Goodwill Ambassador.
