Description

The project employs longitudinal data (registers and surveys) to examine the extent to which populations of immigrant origin are affected by crises and explore the mechanisms underlying the effects behind the precariousness of certain communities. Using Swiss and other country-specific data, the researchers focus on the COVID-19 crisis, as well as on other crises.

The aim of this research project is to highlight differential effects in the consequences of crises according to migration status and personal characteristics, the sector of activity, but also taking into account the gender dimension and the role of skills. Additionally, different socio-economic and demographic outcomes are analyzed. Two disciplines are represented in this research project: economics and demography.
